### Candlemas Compline February 2

We will observe the Presentation of our Lord Jesus Christ in the Temple, also known as Candlemas, with a contemplative service of Compline in the Historic Church on Sunday, February 2, at 7:30 p.m. This feast day commemorates the presentation of Jesus and the purification of Mary in the Jerusalem temple forty days after Jesus' birth, in accordance with the requirements of Jewish law. In the account found in Luke's Gospel, the presentation of Jesus was also the occasion of Jesus meeting with Simeon and Anna. Simeon's prayer of blessing is the basis for the canticle Nunc dimittis.

St. James' School-Based Health Center provides relationship-based care reflecting the school's commitment to a 'Whole Community, Whole School, and Whole Child' model. The trauma-informed paradigm is implemented at the organizational level to recognize, understand, and address the learning and health needs of students and others impacted by traumatic stress. Leah Young, director of the Wellness Center, will lead a discussion about their work, its impact, and the ways in which we can support this important component of St. James School.
